Rose of Sharon Pollypetite Hibiscus x 'Rosina' PPAF

- 4' H 4' W
- Ball-shaped shrub with large lavender-purple flowers in summer
- Very dark green foliage provide a striking contrast
- Dwarf habit
- Heat, drought, and salt tolerant





Sunshine Ligustrum *Ligustrum sinense 'Sunshine'*

- 3-6' H 4-5' W
- Year round gold foliage
- Fast growing compact shrub
- Sterile-no re-seeding
- Salt Tolerant
- Well-drained, rich soil
- Drought tolerant once established
- Sothern Living Collection





Loropetalum Jazz Hands White Dwarf White Loropetalum chinense 'Hakuou'

- 12-36" H 36" W
- Dark green foliage, large white flowers
- Compact mounded
 evergreen shrub
- Needs regular watering, especially in midsummer heat
- Good for containers and borders







Loropetalum 'Pizzaz® Loropetalum chinensis 'Pizzaz'

- 3-8' H 3-6' W
- Evergreen
- Foliage emerges burgundy-green maturing to bronze-green or green
- Low spreading and arching
- Fragrant pink flowers late Winter early Spring
- Regular watering, until established then drought tolerant
- Little pruning needed





Fringe Flower Chinese 'Ruby' Loropetalum_chinense 'rubrum'

- 4-6' H 4-6' W
- Broadleaf evergreen with rounded growth habit and reddish purple leaf color
- Dark pink flowers in early spring
- Moist well-drained slightly acidic soil





Wax Myrtle, Bayberry Myrica cerifera

- To 20' 'H 6-12' W
- Evergreen multi-stemmed native shrub; attractive bark
- Separate male and female plants; need both for berries which birds enjoy
- Blooms July August
- Olive green foliage with spicy scent makes excellent screen
- Prefers acidic, sandy soils; brackish water tolerant.









Rose Peach Drift Rosa Peach Drift 'Meiggile'

- 12-24" H 24" W
- Floriferous dwarf shrubs
- Soft peach blooms cover the plant from mid-spring to the first hard freeze of late Fall
- Strong disease resistance
- It's low, spreading habit makes it perfect for small gardens and combination planters





Rose Red Drift Rosa Red Drift 'Meigalpio'

- 12-24" H 24" W
- Floriferous dwarf shrubs
- Red petite cluster cover the plant from spring to summer
- Strong disease resistance
- It's low, spreading habit makes it perfect for small gardens and combination planters





Sunrosa[™] Red Shrub Rose Rosa x 'ZARSBJOH'

- 14-24" H 12-18" W
- Compact shrub rose
- Long-flowering and performs well in heat and humidity
- Exceptional disease resistance
- True red double blooms have a mild, tea-rose fragrance
- It's low, spreading habit makes it perfect for small gardens and combination planters





Sunrosa™ Yellow Shrub Rose Rosa x 'ZARSBSUN' 24,313

- 14-24" H 12-18" W
- Compact shrub rose
- Long-flowering and performs well in heat and humidity
- Exceptional disease resistance.
- Wonderful fragrance with lacy foliage.
- Coral buds open to soft yellow blooms with a faint coral blush overlay.
- Perfect for small gardens and combination planters





Spirea Double Play Big Bang Spiraea japonica 'Tracy'

- 2-3' H 2-3' W
- Bright yellow foliage and rich pink flowers.
- Compact grower
- Grows best in full or partial sun. Maintains its compact, mounded shape with very little pruning
- Deciduous



Spirea 'Shibori' Spiraea japonica 'Shirobana'

- 2-3' H 2-3' W
- Flowers forming flat clusters by mid-June in colors of white, pink and red
- Dense mounded shrub medium green leaves
- Grows best in full or partial sun. Maintains its compact, mounded shape with very little pruning
- Deciduous
- Salt tolerant





Blueberry 'Becky Blue' Vaccinium ashei 'Becky Blue' Rabbiteye

- 6'H 6'W
- Deciduous shrub heat and humidity tolerant
- Blooms mid to late spring; pick fruit every 7-10 days
- Prefers rich, moist lower pH acidic soil
- Plant several varieties for good pollination







Blueberry 'Climax' Vaccinium ashei 'Climax' Rabbiteye

Native Plant

- 6-8'H 6'W
- Deciduous shrub heat and humidity tolerant
- Blooms early season; sweet tasting berry
- Prefers rich, moist lower pH acidic soil
- Plant several varieties for good pollination
- Fall color



Arrowood Viburnum 'Blue Muffin' Viburnum dentatum 'Christom'

- 5-7' H 5-7' W
- Deciduous shrub
- Creamy white summer flowers are followed by blue fruit in late summer
- Leave flowers for fall berries
- Native. Fruit is good for birds
- To produce berries, you'll need another V. dentatum
- Adapts to variety of soils





Snowball Viburnum Viburnum macrocephalum

- 6-15' H 10-12' W
- Semi-evergreen
- Moist well drained soil
- Late spring, it bears flower clusters sometimes up to 8 inches wide—that start out chartreuse and turn pure white





Viburnum Doublefile 'Mariesii' Viburnum plicatum f. tomentosum 'Mariesii'

- 10-12'H 12-15'W
- Full sun to part shade
- A dense, multi-stemmed, deciduous shrub with distinctively tiered horizontal branching that typically matures into a broad-rounded form
- Large flat lace-cap white blooms in spring
- Medium moisture soil
- Red berry-like drupes for birds



Arrowwood Viburnum 'All That Glitters' Viburnum dentatum var. deamii

- 4-5' H 4-5' W
- Glossy foliage
- Summer brings hundreds of white flower clusters
- Shiny blue fruits follow if pollinator 'All That Glows' Viburnum is nearby
- Prune after flowering
- Deciduous
- Remove dead / old wood in Spring







Arrowwood Viburnum 'All That Glows' Viburnum dentatum var. deamii

- 4-5' H 4-5' W
- Glossy foliage
- Summer brings hundreds of white flower clusters
- Shiny blue fruits follow if pollinator 'All That Glitters' Viburnum is nearby
- Deciduous
- Remove dead / old wood in Spring
- Well drained soils



North Carolina Native Plant



'Blue Diddley' Chastetree *Vitex agnus-castus 'Blue Diddley'*

- 3-6' H 12' W
- Deciduous
- Terminal clusters of fragrant violet flowers over an extended season
- Flowers on new growth
- Blue summer flowers on a compact plant
- Blooms on new wood
- Thrives in heat; seacoast exposure
- Well drained soil





'Delta Blues' Chaste Tree *Vitex agnus-castus 'Delta Blues'*™

- 8-10' H 8-10' W
- Well-drained soils, and drought tolerant once established
- Compact, rounded to upright growth habit.
- Fragrant, dark bluish-purple flowers followed by small, shiny, reddish fruit
- The foliage is dark green
- Well drained soil
- Salt tolerant





Shoal Creek Chaste Tree Vitex agnus-castus 'Shoal Creek'

- 12' H 12' W
- Deciduous
- Terminal clusters of fragrant violet flowers over an extended season
- Flowers on new growth
- Becomes a small tree over time with a wide open canopy and aromatic graygreen foliage
- Thrives in heat; seacoast exposure
- Well drained soil





Vines

There are several vines which should interest North Carolina gardeners and landscapers. Vines, when used correctly, can be quite an aesthetic and functional addition to the landscape. Many vines will become perennial landscape additions, especially those planted and allowed to grow on a trellis or an arbor. The structure should get special attention also. Be certain to construct the support structure with weatherproof materials. Use the naturally decay resistant woods such as red cedar or use treated materials. Brick, iron, or concrete are also acceptable as support structures for vines. (NCSU.edu)

Clematis 'Innocent Blush'

- 6-8' H 12"W
- Large 5-7" semi-double dark rose blossoms with lighter pearl pink accents
- Blooms early summer with a second bloom late summer
- Perennial "Queen of the Climbers" will train onto trellises, fences, or arch over doorways
- Root ball must be shaded



Clematis 'Cardinal Red'

- 6-10' H 12" W
- Large 4-6" crimson red blossoms with contrasting cream colored antlers
- Blooms July October
- Perennial "Queen of the Climbers" will train onto trellises, fences, or arch over doorways
- Rootball must be shaded






Jasmine Combo Pot

Gelsemium s. - Pride of Augusta – and rankinii

- Enjoy beautiful yellow flowers nearly half the year. Great combination of two yellow flowering vines, one with single flowers in fall and spring and the other with fragrant double flowers in spring
- Sun yellow
- Sites with well-drained and moderately fertile soil





Coral Honeysuckle 'Major Wheeler' Lonicera sempervirens

- 3-12' H 1-2' W
- Well drained soil
- The trumpet shaped blooms cover this deciduous vine as it twines up a fence or trellis
- Drought, heat and humidity tolerant
- Blazing red and gold blooms
- Hummingbird magnet





Confederate Jasmine *Thrachelospermum jasminoides*

- Evergreen vine or groundcover with lustrous dark green leaves
- Fragrant white flowers from May to June and periodically thereafter
- Grows to 20'



American Wisteria Amethyst Falls Wisteria frutescens 'Amethyst Falls'

- 8-10' vine
- Intense blue flowers with a light fragrance
- Well behaved vine is easily maintained with light pruning
- Flowers first year on new growth
