Blue Flame Series Garden Blue

Phlox paniculata Blue Flame®

- 12-16"H 18"W
- Dwarf variety with deep blue flowers with violet centers
- Container plant
- Blooms Summer to Fall
- Very fragrant
- Resistant to powdery mildew
- Moist well drained soil

Phlox 'Jeana'

Phlox paniculata 'Jeana'

- 4-5'H 2-3'W
- Herbaceous Perennial
- Fragrant tubular lavender pink flowers late Summer to Fall
- Outstanding mildew resistance
- Does best with some shade in hot afternoon
- Well drained moist soil
- Best-performing Phlox from the Mt. Cuba trial

Sombrero Baja Burgundy Coneflower

Echinacea Sombrero® Baja Burgundy 'Balsombabur' PPAF

- 20-24"H 22-2"W
- Perennial blooms mid summer through early fall
- Well drained moist soil
- Drought and heat tolerant, once established
- Produces well-branched, sturdy and compact plants with a high bud count
- Deep burgundy single flowers surrounding a large brown cone

Purple Coneflower

Echinacea purpurea

- 2-3' H 18-24" W
- Perennial
- Dry /medium soil
- Long lasting violet blooms in summer a top long stems
- Seeds provide food source for birds

Coneflower

Echinacea purpurea 'Green Twister'

- Perennial
- Blooms summer to Fall
- Moist well drained soil
- Drought, heat and humidity tolerant
- Horizontal facing petals with range of color patterns
- Sturdy stems
- Pollinator magnet

Anise Hyssop 'Mango Tango'

Agastache Mango Tango

- 16-18"H 14-16" W
- Compact herbaceous perennial
- Blooms from summer until frost
- Individual flowers have dusky rose calyxes and light peach to dusky orange flowers
- Drought tolerant
- Does not grow well with 'wet feet'

Anise Hyssop 'Blue Fortune'

Agastache 'Blue Fortune'

- 3-5'H 12-24" W
- Herbaceous perennial
- Blooms from summer
- until frost
- Individual flowers are blue-violet
- Drought tolerant
- Does not grow well with 'wet feet'

Blue Giant Hyssop

Agastache foeniculum

- 2-4'H 18-36"W
- Herbaceous perennial
- Citrus scented foliage
- Blooms from summer until frost
- Drought tolerant
- Does not grow well with 'wet feet'
- Refreshing anise scent, attracting hummingbirds and butterflies



Stokes Aster

Stokesia laevis 'Peachie's Pick'

- 12-18"H 18-20"W
- Herbaceous evergreen perennial
- Blooms starting Summer
- Neat dwarf plant
- Semi-evergreen
- Moist well drained soil
- Features fluffy 2-3" cornflower-like blue flower
- Deadhead to promote more blooms



Nodding Onion

Allium cernuum

- 12-18"H 8-10"W
- Herbaceous perennial bulb
- Delicate onion has gently nodding pink flowers in late spring
- Grows well in a perennial border, open woods, or meadow
- Moist average soil

Arkansas Threadleaf Blue Star Amsonia

Amsonia hubrichtii

- 3' H 2-3' W
- Herbaceous perennial
- Flowers light blue and turn white as season progresses
- Feathery foliage turns golden in Fall
- Well drained moist soil

Green and Gold 'Allen Bush'

Chrysogonum virginianum 'Allen Bush'

- 6"H 12"W
- Perennial groundcover
- Semi-evergreen
- Starts blooming in the Spring for many weeks
- Yellow daisy like flowers in Spring
- Consistently moist acidic soil



False Sunflower 'Summer Nights'

Heliopsis 'Summer Nights'

- 3-4'H 2-3'W
- Herbaceous perennial
- Blooms Summer
- Moist well drained soil
- Cut back stems in Spring to reduce height
- Clump-forming, sunflower-like, with yellow-orange rays and brown centers on stiff stems
- Deadhead to prolong season
- Seeds for song birds in winter

'Ox-eye' Daisy

Heliopsis helianthoides 'Burning Hearts'

- 4' H 12-18"W
- Perennial
- Blooms summer to Fall
- Moist well drained soil
- Drought, heat and humidity tolerant
- Yellow orange petals with dark stems
- Sturdy stems
- Pollinator magnet

Swamp Sunflower

Helianthus agustifolius

- 5-7' H 4" W
- Clump forming herbaceous perennial
- Flowers small, but organized into larger heads resembling a single, radially symmetrical flower
- cupped by a ring of green bracts
- Prefers moist soil
- Blooms Fall

Cardinal Flower

Lobelia cardinalis

- 2-4'H 2'W
- Clump forming slender perennial with red blooms
- Blooms late summer
- Moist to wet soil
- Found in moist meadows, thickets, along banks of streams or woodland edge
- The nectar of the flowers attracts Swallowtail and Checkered White butterflies



Bee Balm 'Claire Grace'

Monarda fistulosa 'Claire Grace'

- 3' H 2' W
- Herbaceous perennial
- AKA Wild Bergamot
- Fragrant lavender blooms in Summer
- Prefers rich humus well drained soils
- Mildew resistant in hot climates
- Spreads by creeping rhizomes

Spotted Bee Balm

Monarda punctata

- 24-30"H 12"W
- Herbaceous perennial
- Pink bracts and creamy white to yellow flowers with purple spots Summer to Fall
- Fragrant flowers
- Well drained soil
- Allow good air circulation to combat fungal leaf diseases

Mexican Beardtongue 'Red Rocks'

Penstemon x Mexicali 'Red Rocks'

- 14-18"H 12-14' W
- Perennial
- Average, dry to medium, well-drained soils
- Tolerant to drought, heat and humidity once established
- Avoid wet, poorly-drained soils
- Shear after first blooms to encourage second bloom

Mexican Beardtongue 'Blackbeard'

Penstemon 'Beardtongue'

- 28-34" H 24"W
- Easily grown in average, dry to medium, well-drained soils
- Tolerant of drought, heat and humidity
- Avoid wet, poorly-drained soils
- Dark purple flower stems hold its lilac-purple flowers with white flaring tubes high above the low mound of deep eggplant purple leaves.
- Blooms Spring-Summer

Woodland Phlox

Phlox divacarta 'Blue Moon'

- 12-18"H 12-14"W
- Dwarf variety with deep blue flowers with violet centers
- Creeps to spread
- Blooms late Spring-early Summer
- Very fragrant
- Resistant to powdery mildew
- Moist well drained soil
- Bright shade

Pickereel

Pontederia cordata

- 3.5' H with 7" long leaf blades that arise from below ground
- Long terminal violet flower spikes - 3-4
- Herbaceous perennial
- Grows along edges of lakes, ponds and streams and can tolerate water up to maximum water depth 30"
- It's been around long enough to have its own bee for pollination, the Dufourea, which visits this plant for nectar and pollen and does not visit any other plant
- Several ducks also eat the seeds including Mallard, Black Duck, Green-Winged Teal, and Wood Duck

Short-toothed Mountain Mint

Pycnanthemum muticum

- 2-3'H 2' W
- Herbaceous perennial with showy blooms from July - September
- Leaves have strong spearmint aroma
- Moist to medium moisture, well drained soil best at woodland garden
- Somewhat drought tolerant
- This plant dances with the busy fluttering of honeybees, butterflies, beneficial wasps, and moths

Spiderwort

Tradescantia 'Sweet Kate'

- 18"H 12-18" W
- Perennial
- Deep blue blooms Summer through Fall open in heat of day
- Golden yellow foliage
- Prefers moist soil but will tolerate dry when established
- When the stems of spiderworts are cut, a secretion is released which becomes threadlike and silky when hardened (like a spider's web) hence the name



Iron Butterfly 'Ironweed'

Vernonia lettermannii

- 30-36"H 30-36" W
- Narrow leaf Ironweed
- Herbaceous perennial
- Masses of tiny, true purple flowers with delicate green foliage
- Very tolerant of rough, sandy, infertile, dry soils
- Blooms late Summer - Fall



Gay Feather – Blazing Star

Liatris spicata

- To 6' H 1' W
- Perennial upright and clumping
- Well drained to wet soils
- Salt tolerant
- Racemes of pink flowers in Summer to late Summer

Wild Columbine

Aquilegia Candensis

- 1-3 ' H 1' Spread
- Blooms early Spring
- Thrives in part to full shade in any well-drained soil.
- Red flowers with red centers
- Plants reseed readily
- Salt tolerant
- Larval host for Columbine Duskywing



Rattlesnake Master

Eryngium yuccifolium

- Herbaceous perennial
- 4-5'H 2-3'W
- Blooms: showy, greenish-white in June - September
- Tolerates drought, erosion, clay soil, dry soil, shallow-rocky soil. Prefers dryish, sandy soil
- Attracts pollinators
- No serious insect or disease problems



Tickseed 'Berry Chiffon'

Coreopsis 'Berry Chiffon' PP27414

- 15-18"H space 18-24"
- Perennial; sterile
- Well drained soil
- Blooms mid Summer - Fall
- White flowers with a vibrant raspberry red eye
- Resistant to powdery mildew
- Tolerates drought
- Salt tolerant

Obedient Plant

Physostegia virginiana

- 36" H 20" W
- Light pink/lilac snapdragon like flowers
- Blooms in Summer
- Moist humus rich soil
- Called 'Obedient Plant' because each individual flower will, upon being pushed in any one direction, temporarily remain in the new position



Goldenrod 'Fireworks'

Solidago rugosa 'Fireworks'

- 3-4' H 3' W
- Blooms late summer through Fall
- Clumping perennial with cascading flowers that look like exploding fireworks
- Drier soils
- Songbirds eat the seeds



Coral Honeysuckle 'Major Wheeler'

Lonicera sempervirens

- 3-12' H 1-2' W
- Well drained soil
- The trumpet shaped blooms cover this deciduous vine as it twines up a fence or trellis
- Drought, heat and humidity tolerant
- Blazing red and gold blooms
- Hummingbird magnet



Swamp Milkweed

Asclepias incarnata

- 4'H 2-3' W
- Herbaceous perennial
- Moist / muddy soil
- Rose purple fragrant flowers starting early summer
- Narrow lance shaped leaves
- Larval host for Monarch and Queen butterflies
- Collect seeds Oct-Nov



Butterfly Milkweed

Asclepias tuberosa

- 1-3' H 1' W
- Blooms orange - red in Summer
- Perennial
- Well drained soil
- Larval food source for the Monarch, Queens, Grey Hairstreak butterflies
- Slow to emerge in Spring

White Wild Indigo

Baptisia alba

- 2-4' H 2-3'W
- Perennial
- White pea-like flowers blooming April -May
- Well drained soil
- Seed pods provide Fall interest
- Host for Wild Indigo Dusky Wing and Frosted Elfin butterflies

Three-lobed Coneflower or Brown-eyed Susan

Rudbeckia triloba

- 2-3 ' H 12-18" W
- Yellow blooms starting late Summer to early Fall
- Bushy, free-flowering, 2-3' (to 5') tall biennial or short-lived perennial
- Masses of 1-2" wide, daisy-like, golden-yellow flowers with flat, purplish-brown centers on hairy stems
- Host for Gorgone Checkerspot and Bordered Patch butterfly



Hearts-a-Burstin / Strawberry Bush

Euonymus americanus

- 4-6' H 4-6' W
- Perennial
- Small shrub with green stems and tiny, inconspicuous flowers
- Red fruits that look like strawberries bursting out of their red coats in Fall
- Blooms spring
- Leaves turn red in Fall
- Fruit is popular with birds

Coastal Joe Pye Weed

Eutrochium dubium

- to 24" H 4-6' W
- Perennial blooms late Summer
- Habitat: Meadows and fields, shores of rivers or lakes
- Moist to wet soils
- Larval host to over 42 butterflies and moths
- Songbirds eat seeds



Southern Blue Flag Iris

Iris virginica


- 1-3' H 1-3' W
- Perennial
- Medium to wet soil in full sun
- Excellent plant for waters edge or Rain Garden
- Leafless flower stalks bear 2-6 flowers
- Violet blue with yellow and white crested falls
- Blooms late Spring



White-top Star Sedge

Rhynchospora colorata

- Short-lived perennial grass
- 1.5 - 2.5' H 1.5 – 2'W
- Showy white flowers which attract pollinators
- Blooms April - Sept
- Likes wet to moist soil — use in wetland garden



Aster 'October Skies'

Symphyotrichum oblongifolium 'October Skies'

- 2-3' H 2-3' W
- Perennial slowly spreading with aromatic foliage
- Small, daisy-like flowers with blue to blue-purple rays and yellow center
- Blooms in Fall
- 2000 NC Wildflower of Year



Aster 'Raydon's Favorite'

Symphotrichum oblongifolium

'Raydon's Favorite'

- 2-3'H 2-3'W
- Perennial aromatic aster
- Beautiful mounded appearance with masses of violet-blue, daisy-like flowers on 2-3' tall multi-stemmed plant
- Blooms mid to late autumn
